



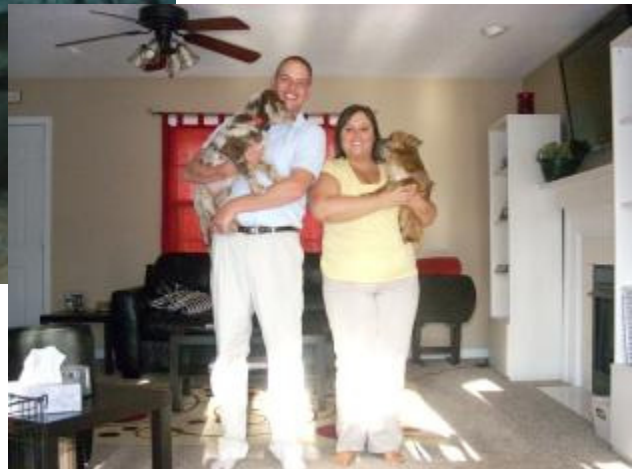
Brendan , a handsome young hound mix was rescued from the pound in March and was transferred to Pet Connect Rescue. He was adopted on May 2.

Andy's Tail

Andy's story is a special one in which three lives were changed for the better and forever. At the center of this story are two remarkable individuals, one, a paralyzed woman, who in 2008 became a shut in. The other is a lovely, affectionate dog who ended up in a kill shelter.

Last January, a woman, call her Mary, asked her husband if they could get a dog. The reason why: so she could have joy and hope in her life where she had none. Mary is permanently disabled, unable to walk. For over 40 years Mary persevered with courage, determination and resilience. The result was a full and satisfying life. She graduated with honors at undergraduate and graduate school, traveled internationally, worked in NYC, married in Vienna and rescued three dogs. But in 2008, life dealt another cruel blow. Mary became home bound, unable to leave her residence even for a half day: age, her paralysis and new health problems now confines her to home. Our first meeting with Andy was memorable and a portent of things to come. He jumped out of the Pet Connect volunteer's Hummer, looking scared and emaciated. He ran across the street, stood up and embraced Dan, his new dad. In that instant, all uncertainty and anxiety disappeared, Mary's, Dan 's and of course Andy's. Mary and Dan had a wonderful new addition to the family and Andy was home at last.

Rescuing Andy has been so rewarding and satisfying. He is a sweet, affectionate and happy dog. He continues to delight us with his antics. Every day, Andy says good morning to Mary by jumping up on the bed giving her exuberant nuzzles and kisses. What a way to start every day! We sense he really appreciates his forever home. When he is half asleep on the floor and someone enters the room, he will wag the very, very tip of his tail to say he's happy to see you.

Rescuing Andy saved this brave, dear dog's life. Mary and Dan's lives have in a real sense been saved as well. For these reasons we are deeply and forever indebted to those who brought Andy to us. -
